- Apply for Unemployment Compensation (UC) online http://labor.hawaii.gov/ui/
 - You may also qualify if your work hours have been cut or reduced to zero but you are still employed.
 - For those self-employed or who are not usually eligible for UC, Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) is receiving applications online http://pua.hawaii.gov
 - The CARES Act provides an additional \$600 per week for beneficiaries through July 31.
